Treasurer's Report - November Data

Income in the month of November was \$12,330.00 (budget \$9,429.75); expenditures totaled \$7,130.60 (budget \$9,429.75), resulting in income for the month of \$5,199.40.

Book value of the Endowment Fund at the end of November was \$73,059.87; market value as of November 30 was \$81,554.86, a gain of \$2,039.85 for the month.

Vestry Report

The Vestry met on Dec. 18th for the last meeting of 2024. The biggest news out of the meeting is the proposal to be placed on the Annual Congregational Meeting to reduce the number of members of Vestry from the current 6 to 4. With the current size of the active membership, it has been difficult to field a slate of candidates and to maintain an active participation of a 6-member Vestry. If the proposal passes, there will be no need to have a Vestry election this year.

The Annual Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday Jan 26th, immediately following mass.

With Susan Payne leaving the Vestry this term, we are in need of a new Registrar. This would require being present at all Vestry meetings (6 per year) and taking notes, preparing and distributing minutes and keeping a file of vestry related correspondence. Anyone interested in volunteering, please contact either Fr. Michael or Bryan Jacobs.

We are planning on having a Shrove Tuesday gathering at IHOP again this year. Shrove Tuesday is March $4^{\rm th}$.

The Bishop's visit to Grace will be on Sunday March 9.

The next Vestry meeting is scheduled for Feb. 19, 2025 at 3 PM in the Family Center.
